# FEES & IMPORTANT INFO

## MEMBERSHIP

All participants must be enrolled as a member of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Manchester (BGCGM). A \$25 membership fee is required in addition to the weekly Summer Program fees. The membership expires on June 30, 2027.

Kidz Kamp, Camp Foster, and Tween/Teen Full Day, may be paid in full at the time of registration, at a discounted rate of \$215/week.

Week 2 is only \$180, since it is a 4-day week. **All Summer Programs will be closed on Friday, July 3, 2026.**

You may reserve any week with a deposit of \$25, with the balance to be paid no later than the Monday two full weeks before the beginning of the reserved week, see billing schedule for specific dates. A late payment fee of \$10 will be assessed to balances not paid on or before the due date. If the balance and late payment fee are not paid within 48-hours of the original balance due date, the reserved week and full deposit will be automatically forfeited.

You may pre-pay in full or with a deposit for as many weeks as you wish. A member's name will only be added to the roster for a specific week once they are paid in full for that week. Early registration is encouraged as each week fills quickly. A waiting list is established when a week reaches capacity.

## PAYMENT INFORMATION

Credit cards, personal checks, and cash will be accepted for payments. A \$20 fee will be assessed on all returned checks. In person or online portal, payment is due at the time of registration.

## LATE FEES

A late pick-up fee of \$1/minute will be billed for members not picked up by the scheduled pick-up time.

## YEAR-END STATEMENTS

Parents/guardians should keep all receipts on file, as BGCGM does not prepare year-end statements of fees paid; however, your year-end statement can be found in your Procure account at [myprocure.com](http://myprocure.com). BGCGM's Federal Tax ID Number is 02-0226033. Parents/guardians, it is your responsibility, not your child's, to ensure that payments are received by the due date. No exceptions are made.

# IMPORTANT INFO CONTINUED

## CANCELLATION & WEEK CHANGE

A refund for a cancellation will only be considered if the request for cancellation is made in writing, to the office, at least two full weeks before the requested cancellation. Requests made less than two full weeks in advance will not be considered for a refund. A charge of \$10/week/camper will be assessed for all cancellations to cover administrative costs. Refunds of \$15 or less will be applied to future balances due.

Week changes will only be made if the office is notified at least two full weeks before the week of the requested change, and upon availability. No cancellation fee is assessed if the change is possible.

All cancellations or week change requests must be made in writing to the Front Desk at [frontdesk@bgcgm.org](mailto:frontdesk@bgcgm.org). Phone cancellations will not be accepted.

PLEASE NOTE: Refunds are not guaranteed, and at the discretion of management, for suspensions and expulsions.

## TRANSPORTATION

BGCGM provides bus transportation for members to and from Camp Foster, Southern NH University, and field trips. For Camp Foster program members, the buses generally leave the Union Street Clubhouse around 8:20am, and returns around 4:15pm. All Camp Foster members should report no later than 8:15am.

## SUMMER PROGRAM ATTIRE

All members should dress appropriately based on the weather conditions for each day. Members are encouraged to bring a backpack with extra clothes and sunscreen. All belongings and clothing should be marked for easy identification.

## FOOTWEAR

For the safety and well-being of all members, SNEAKERS are the only appropriate and acceptable daily footwear. Crocs and sandals are only allowed on field trip days.

## WHAT TO BRING TO SUMMER PROGRAM

Each day, members should bring a lunchbox packed with snacks and a lunch that does not need refrigeration. All drinks (water, sports drinks, etc.) are to be in a reusable water bottle. No plastic disposable bottles allowed.

Members are requested not to bring cell phones, electronic games, radios, or other items of value.

Kidz Kamp, Camp Foster, and Tween/Teen - Full Day members will also want to bring a swimsuit and a towel - as swimming or water play is always a possibility.

## IMPORTANT: MEDICAL EXAM

New Hampshire state law requires that BGC GM have on file current information that states your child is properly immunized and is physically fit to attend the Summer Program. This may be in the form of a Physician's Statement, or a copy of a current physical exam, and a copy of the child's immunization record.

PLEASE NOTE: This medical exam must be within 24 months of June 22, 2026. THIS INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION. Without this information on file, your child will NOT be able to register, and fees paid will be subject to the cancellation policies noted in this brochure.

for the 2026-2027 School Year

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Manchester is excited to partner with Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU) on a NEW pilot program, STEM Launch Lab, a 5-week summer experience designed for youth entering grades 5-8. Participants will split their days between the Union Street Clubhouse and SNHU's campus, giving them a unique blend of Club-based learning and real-world university experiences. Each week focuses on a different STEM theme, led by SNHU staff members working in the field, including engineering, aeronautics, robotics, coding, design thinking, and hands-on innovation.

## WHAT'S INCLUDED IN YOUR WEEKLY FEE

Commemorative t-shirt, transportation to and from SNHU, activity materials, and certificates of completion at the end of each week.

## AGE RESTRICTIONS

Members must be at least 10 years old by July 1, 2026, to participate in the program. Weekly registration is limited to 50 members.

## AFTERNOON SUPERVISION

Members in grade 5, can join the Camp Foster Afternoon Supervision for an additional \$30/week.

Members in grades 6-8, can join the Tween/Teen Drop-in program for Afternoon Supervision.
